THE Soviet journal Optika i Spektroskopiia is now being translated on a regular basis and distributed (together with the Journal of the Optical Society of America) to all members of the Optical Society. Under a grant to the Society from the National Science Foundation, the translation from Russian into English is being done by Morris D. Friedman, Inc., and the translated journal is printed for the OSA by the Blackburn Printing Co., Concord, Mass., under the title Optics and Spectroscopy.

The original journal, which is a publication of the Soviet Academy of Sciences, is edited by S. E. Frish and is now in its sixth year. The first issue to appear in English translation is that of January 1959 (Vol. VI, No. 1). The two publications, Optics and Spectroscopy and the Journal of the Optical Society of America, are available only as a unit. The nonmember subscription price for both is \$25 in the United States and Canada and \$28 elsewhere. Society of Rheology

PAPERS presented at the Society of Rheology's 1957 annual meeting have been collected and published as Volume II of the Transactions of the Society of Rheology, under the editorship of R. D. Andrews of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Fifteen papers from the technical program are printed in full, and abstracts of other papers presented at the meeting are included. The volume is available for \$8.50 from the publisher (Interscience Publishers, Inc., 250 Fifth Avenue, New York 1, N. Y.). Volume I of the Transactions, containing papers presented at the 1956 annual meeting, is still available from Interscience at a price of \$6 per copy.

Collections of papers given at earlier annual meetings of the Society were published in journals (notably the Journal of Colloid Science and the Journal of Applied Physics). In order to provide a consistent archival form for the publication of rheological papers, the Society decided in 1957 to establish the Transactions, and it is intended that they shall appear annually.
