

MARSHALL BRUCER, physiology professor at the University of Texas School of Medicine, has been appointed chairman of the medical division of the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies and will direct the cancer research program there. Russell S. Poor, dean of the Graduate School of Alabama Polytechnic Institute, was named chairman of the Institute's university relations division.
