dissolved in metals. No effort has been spared to make the present book both fair and complete in its field and the result is a work which one must read if one is concerned with the strange effects of gases in metals.

The book begins with a periodic table showing the elements which occlude hydrogen, in some cases with evolution of heat and in others with heat absorption. Particularly valuable is the annotated bibliography of 1470 references. The literature is complete through 1946. Aside from supplementary notes and an index the book ends with a fifteen page survey of points covered. Particularly striking is the linear decrease of magnetism of palladium with hydrogen concentration reported on pages 215 and 216. It is not easy to see what could have been left out of the fourteen chapters. An easier book to read, however, will be written at some future time when the theoretical interconnections become more clearly apparent. The book is recommended as a very careful and thorough report by a man who has taken the trouble to know what he is talking about.


