Lester Hirsch

Lester Hirsch, emeritus professor of physics at California State University, Los Angeles, died at the age of 80 on 26 February 1996, from injuries sustained when he was assaulted outside his home.

Lester was born and raised in New York City. He received BS (1938) and MS (1939) degrees in physics from Wayne State University. After teaching at the high school and college levels in Michigan, and doing war-related research at the University of Michigan, Lester moved to California in 1946. He taught high school, then college physics at Compton College, East Los Angeles College and UCLA before he joined the CSULA faculty in 1960. Lester almost singlehandedly turned the liberal arts segment of the physics curriculum into a premier program.

One of the many strengths of Lester's teaching methods was the use of a wide assortment of demonstration materials. Much of his outstanding equipment now resides in an exploratorium at CSULA that is regularly visited by groups of students, ranging in level from elementary school to university.

Lester was the spark that ignited the Southern California section of the American Association of Physics Teachers for nearly 50 years. He held every elective office in the section, some more than once. He served as the section's representative to the national organization for most of his career. In the early 1960s, he chaired the AAPT committee on elementary sciences. He started the High School Competitive Examination, an annual competition sponsored by AAPT's Southern California section, and he was very active in arranging college and university scholarships for students who participated in the competition. Lester's many important contributions to physics education were officially recognized with AAPT's Distinguished Service Citation in 1978.

Lester was also vitally involved with physics education in developing countries. In addition to teaching in Korea, Japan, Guyana and India, his project, "Books for Democracy," distributed textbooks to developing countries. This program led to his long association with the Asia Foundation, which has sent more than half a million physics books and journals to schools in Asia.

Lester Hirsch was a productive physics teacher and a compassionate human being. His warmth, enthusiasm and dedication will be sorely missed.
