44th Meeting to be held in San Diego

The third meeting of the Acoustical Society of America to be held in the West will take place in California, November 13–15, at the auditorium in San Diego's Balboa Park. The general chairman for this meeting, which is the Society's forty-fourth, is Carl Eckart of the University of California's Marine Physical Laboratory in San Diego. Symposia are being arranged on seismology and acoustics, aircraft noise, and hearing loss after exposure to noise. The technical program will also include contributed papers on a variety of topics in current acoustical research. Headquarters hotel for the meeting will be the U. S. Grant. R. W. Young, U. S. Navy Electronics Laboratory, San Diego 52, California, is in charge of program arrangements.

Ultrasonic Absorption

ONR Symposium this Month

A two-day symposium on ultrasonic absorption in fluids, sponsored by the Office of Naval Research, is to be held October 16-17 at the Ultrasonics Laboratory of Brown University, Providence, R. I. Mason of Bell Telephone Laboratories; E. A. Hiedemann of Michigan State College; F. W. deWette of the University of Utrecht and Brown University; H. M. Mott-Smith of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology; J. J. Markham of the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Laboratory; and A. F. Chhapgar of the National Physical Laboratory of India and Brown University.

Institute of Metals Symposium in London

A symposium on the properties of metallic surfaces, organized by the Institute of Metals, London, will be held in that city in the lecture theater of the Royal Institution of Great Britain on November 19. Third Conference Next January
