They are short and present a number of methods, with little discussion of how they work, how good they are, to what they may be applied or how to choose among them. Also, many of the most powerful modern techniques, such as multigrid and conjugate gradient methods, are not even mentioned.

All in all, this is a useful addition to the literature for readers whose in-

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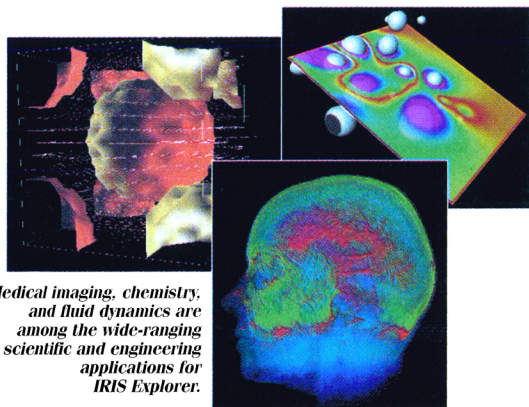
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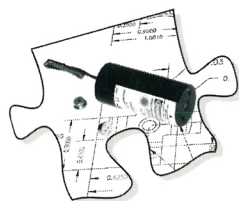
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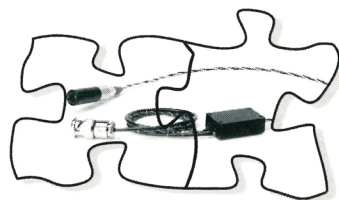
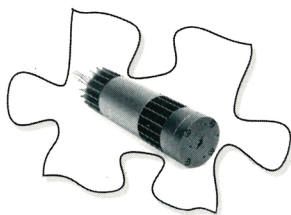
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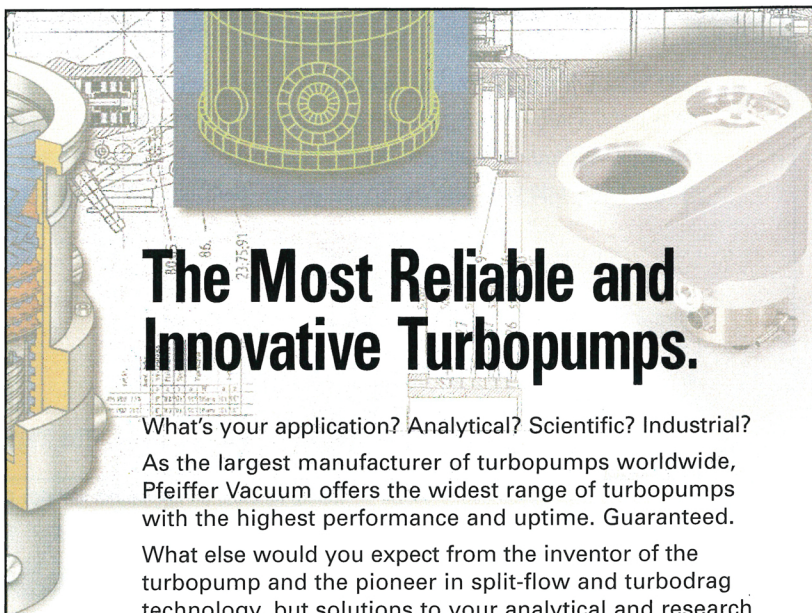
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
