Joint Symposium at Schenectady

The General Electric Company and the Eastern New York Section of the American Chemical Society will be hosts for the 1953 joint summer symposium of the Solid State Division of the American Physical Society and the Division of Physical and Inorganic Chemistry of the American Chemical Society. The three-day symposium will be held June 16-18 at the G-E Research Laboratory, Schenectady, N. Y. Twenty-seven papers are listed in the program. The main subjects to be treated include coloration of solids by impurities, activators in luminescent crystals, the photographic process, analysis for trace impurities, and the role of impurities in semiconductors and transistors.
