

Gases and Liquids

Molecular Theory of Gases and Liquids, by J. O. Hirschfelder and C. F. Curtiss, both of the University of Wisconsin Naval Research Laboratory and department of chemistry, and R. B. Bird, of the Wisconsin chemistry engineering department, is a 1219-page survey of the equilibrium (equation of state, etc.) and non-equilibrium (transport phenomena) properties of gases and liquids, reduced to a "common basis" employing consistent notation and related by means of statistical mechanics to the complexities of intermolecular forces. This monumental volume, the most recent of the Wiley Structure of Matter Series, is an outgrowth, according to the authors, of studies undertaken in the "Bumblebee" program sponsored by the Navy Bureau of Ordnance and is a synthesis of the contributions made by a large number of people, many of whom are members of the Wisconsin NRL staff. The book is liberally supplied with charts and tables and, as a reference volume, will no doubt be considered an indispensable piece of equipment for workers in those branches of chemistry and chemical physics concerned with the behavior of matter in the liquid or gaseous states. Heat Conduction

Previous editions of this book, *Heat Conduction with Engineering, Geological, and Other Applications*, were published by the McGraw-Hill Company. New chapters have been added on the drying of soils, which are said to follow the heat flow equations, and on the heat pump. Though of some interest to the physics student, the book will be chiefly useful to those who need approximate solutions of practical problems of heat flow and diffusion. (By Leonard R. The Actinide Elements

Volume 14A of Division IV—the Plutonium Project Record—has been issued as part of the National Nuclear Energy Series. This volume, *The Actinide Elements*, edited by G. T. Seaborg and Joseph J. Katz (870 pp.; McGraw-Hill, New York, 1954; \$11.75) is one of the most thorough of the series. In addition to several chapters on the chemistry of the elements actinium through californium, there are chapters on their nuclear properties, fission properties, optical properties, and an excellent chapter on the crystal chemistry of the 5f elements. The book also contains the index for volume 14B of the series, *The Transuranium Elements*.

Exterior Ballistics

Uitwendige Ballistiek by W. Bevelander (165 pp.; Excelsior Publ.; The Hague, 1954) is a small paper-bound Dutch monograph on exterior ballistics. The book outlines the several methods for calculating gun trajectories. Several theories are described and the appropriate formulae are derived.
